



Jurien Bay Boat Harbour



Jurien Bay is located 220 kilometres north of Perth, in the Wheatbelt region. It is a popular location among fishing, diving and snorkeling enthusiasts, with many islands and reefs, as well as the Jurien Bay Marine Park. Sea lions, dolphins and whales may also be sighted in these waters. It is also a great location for swimming, water skiing and sail boarding.

The Jurien Bay Boat Harbour contains 69 boat pens, four service jetties, a four-lane boat ramp, a public beach, and boat maintenance facilities, as well as toilets and car park.

Boating facility fees

Waterway

Harbour basin and entrance channel

The entrance has a design depth of 4 metres with the basin 3.5 metres in the area near the service jetties and boat lifter. A depth of 3 metres is found in the area adjacent to the pen mooring facility and boat launching ramp. A small area near the western shore of the harbour has a depth of only 2 metres.

Boating facilities

Boat pens

Location	The serviced mooring pens are off 2 fixed catwalk jetties, abutting the eastern foreshore of the harbour.
Number of pens	69
Lengths	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A: 8 x 10m, 1 x 15m, 8 x 20m• B: 18 x 15m• C: 12 x 15m, 6 x 12m• D: 16 x 18m
Services	Each catwalk jetty is equipped with single phase power outlets, 4 three phase outlets, 9 water outlets and rubbish receptacles for use by the vessels in the mooring pens. A waste oil receptacle is located near the pens for the benefit of users.

These pens are available for rental on an annual or casual basis. Please contact DoT's Geraldton office to book a pen.

Service jetties

There are four service jetties in the harbour.

Service Jetty 1 (West)

Length	50 x 10 metres
Services	4 single phase and 2 three phase outlets for power, 2 water outlets, a power isolation switch to enable unleaded fuelling by arrangement at the end of the jetty.

Service Jetty 2 (East)

Length	50 x 10 metres
Services	4 single phase and 2 three phase outlets for power, 2 water outlets and 2 fuel outlets.

Fuel Jetty

Length	38 x 4 metres
Services	Diesel fuel provided by Comen Fuel WA available 24/7 by credit card facility. Comen and all major credit cards accepted. . 1 water outlet, no electrical outlet.

Government Jetty

It is a 15 metre long by 4 metre wide jetty to accommodate Fisheries WA vessels.

This jetty can be made available to berth vessels when mooring pens are fully utilised. This is at the discretion of the Department of Transport.

Fueling facilities

Fuel is available from the Fuel jetty. The service is provided by Comen Fuel WA and is available 24/7 by credit card facility. Comen and all major credit cards accepted.

Boat ramp

It is a concrete four lane launching ramp, with two finger jetties and has a universal access pontoon.

Public beach

A public beach is located within the harbour with Dandaragan Council upgrading the area nearby with facilities for beach goers.

Boat maintenance facilities

DoT has provided boat lifter runways in the north east corner of the harbour. Comen Ltd uses these to operate a commercial boat lifter in association with their adjacent boat storage and maintenance facility.

Other facilities and services

Public toilets

There are two blocks of public toilets, one on the east side servicing the pens and boat ramp and one on the north side servicing the jetties.

Public car parks

There are 245 car and trailer parking bays.

Marine rescue

All volunteer marine rescue groups monitor radio listening watches on marine radio 27.88 MHz and VHF Channel 16. Most groups also monitor other frequencies such as 27.90 MHz, 27.91 MHz and VHF channels 72 and 73, as well as their own channels.

Don't hesitate to call any volunteer marine rescue group on your marine radio.

Remember to log on before heading out and log off when you return with your local volunteer marine rescue group, for full radio procedure refer to Boat rules at a glance.
