

APPLICATION PROCESS AND PRICING

What are the timeframes involved?

Applications open	25 July 2022 – 28 August 2022
Assessment Panel consideration	29 August 2022 – 9 September 2022
Collection will be arranged within a two-week period, selected between	12 September 2022 – 30 September 2022.

How will applications be prioritised?

All requests received will be considered in the month of August 2022. Where competitive applications are received, preference will be given for projects that demonstrate wider community benefit.

How will I know if my application is successful?

The assessment panel will consider applications in the first two weeks of September 2022. You will be emailed with the outcome of your application, including advice on collection.

Is the timber free?

Your expression of interest is to gauge the level of community interest in the jetty materials. Each form will be presented to an assessment panel to consider the volumes requested. The intended use of the timber will determine if payment is required. Applications that demonstrate community benefit will be gifted.

How were the prices of timber set?

A qualified heritage architect provided advice to the assessment panel and they reflect current market prices for similar timber. The funds received from the sale of timber, will go towards conservation of the remaining jetty.

Are there limits set for the allocation of Grades 1, 2 and 3 timber?

After the application period closes 28 August 2022, the allocation of volumes will be considered.

Is there a limit on the amount of Grade 4 timber?

This will be at the discretion of the Carnarvon Heritage Group, but as a general principle, Grade 4 timber will not be limited.

What do I put on the Expression of Interest form if I am not representing an organisation?

Nothing, you can leave this field blank.



Why do I have to include an estimated value on the expression of interest?

The estimated value column is just to check we're both on the same page about quantity and quality requested, and in turn the estimated the value. At collection the agent will check availability of the timber and confirm the cost.

Can I view the timber before I apply?

This will be considered on a case-by-case basis when the request involves a large amount of timber. DoT is working with a local agent, who will select the best timber available for each request.

Can I change my request or select additional timber at collection?

The local agent will be responsible for assessing actual timber availability and allocation. New requests for timber be made at collection require an expression of interest and the agent has the discretion and authority to allocate additional timber requests immediately, or shortly following an inventory review.

Do I have to pay before I collect the timber?

Yes, at the point of sale. This can be done by Credit/Mastercard/VISA card transaction on the day. We will provide an immediate tax receipt followed by a detailed invoice for your records.

How will you know the timber has been used for community projects?

We will be interested to know how you go with your project and would like to check-in on your success. Contact will be dependent on your project aspirations and anticipated timeframes for delivery.

ABOUT THE TIMBER

What is the condition of the handrails and balustrades?

The handrails are in variable condition, mostly due to their narrow proportions and deteriorated paint finish, and many, at the time of deconstruction were sagging or have failed at fixing points. The handrails are made from timber, and with some preparation work, can be repainted. Due to the age of the railing, sections may have been painted with lead-based paint and should be treated with caution using correct personal protective equipment.

The handrail stanchions were cut at their base using a hand-held or remote chainsaw and balustrade sections were lifted off as panels, or rails removed individually. Care should be taken when accessing and handling these materials.

These materials are part of the <u>Grading Matrix</u> and <u>Timber Salvage Catalogue</u> (Attachment 1 and 2 respectively on the project web page).

Is the timber treated?

Given the age of the jetty, it's assumed that all timber has been treated and is not safe to burn.
