5.2.	<p>Taxi User Subsidy Scheme (TUSS) reform</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">DoT provided an overview of the TUSS reform.DoT will continue to provide updates through this forum.More information can be found on the DoT website: www.transport.wa.gov.au/tuss
5.3.	<p>Regulatory amendments</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">DoT provided overview of planned regulation amendments which aim to improve the usability of the legislation.DoT will continue to provide updates through this forum. <p>ACTION: Members encouraged to advise DoT whether they feel any elements of the regulations impact on their ability to operate efficiently.</p>
6.	Other items raised by members
6.1.	<p>Operators travelling to regional areas</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Some group members shared their experiences of out-of-town operators travelling to regional areas for work.Members shared concern for reputational risk if these operators are not operating in a compliant manner.
6.2.	<p>Charter vehicle signage requirements</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">DoT confirmed that the charter vehicle signage requirements have not changed.The current DoT compliance focus has shifted towards fare refusals.
6.3.	<p>Upcoming OdT passenger research</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">DoT has begun work to conduct research to benchmark on-demand passenger behaviour and sentiment across WA.DoT will share further updates through this forum.
6.4.	<p>DoT Education and Compliance approach</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Group members and DoT discussed DoT Education and Compliance Officer roles and vehicle check processes.DoT advised that whether or not officers stop vehicles depends on the situation (i.e. there should be a reasonable reason for the officer to pull the vehicle over). For example, if the vehicle is unroadworthy then there is an immediate risk to the passengers.DoT officers are currently targeting refusal of fares and meter usage refusals.
