



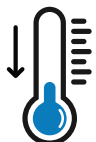

eRideable storing and charging safety

Using an eRideable device is a great way to get around, and it's important to have good strategies to safely manage your Lithium-ion battery.

Keep yourself and the people and property around you safe when storing and charging your eRideable.



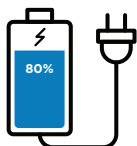
Cool it

- Allow your battery to cool down before charging. Don't charge if the battery is hot to touch.
- Store and charge your device in a cool, dry place away from flammable materials.



Check it

- Regularly check your battery for signs of damage.
- Don't use your eRideable if the battery is damaged.
- Don't modify an eRideable battery, or use an eRideable that's been modified.



Charge it

- Don't overcharge. You don't need to maintain maximum battery charge. Around 80% is ideal and reduces the chance of overheating.
- Don't charge a battery for extended periods or overnight. Use a timer to turn off your charger.
- Use the battery charger that comes with the device. It's not safe to borrow a charger.
